Objectives

- Designed to provide post-graduate level education in Archaeology and Ancient History of Ancient Macedonia and the ancient Greek world in general.
- The research, study and interpretation of the historical and cultural resources of ancient Macedonia will provide students with in depth knowledge on a region of extreme geopolitical and economic importance.
- Cooperation with other University Departments and Research Institutes in Greece and abroad and participation in EU programmes.









Programme Structure

- The MA in the Classical Archaeology and Ancient History of Macedonia is a 3-semester full-time programme of study.
- It is taught mainly on weekdays over three-hour teaching periods.
- The first two semesters cover the courses of the programme.
- Each teaching term has 13 teaching weeks followed by a 10-day exam period.
- The third period is taken up with work on the Master's dissertation.
- The programme is also available in part-time mode.
- ❖It corresponds to 90 ECTS.

About 20 km from the city of Thessaloniki, at the important **Iron Age - Archaic** site of **Trapeza Neo Rysio-Kardia**, with magnificent view over the Thermaic Gulf and the Anthemous valley, our students of both MA programmes are able to practice on the











The site "Trapeza of Neo Rysio-Kardia" belongs to a dense group of settlements that existed along the Thermaic Gulf before the conquest of this region by the Macedonians in the 6th century BC.







In the excavation site, several rectangular and trapezoid **buildings** came to light, built with walls whose lower parts were made of stone and the upper parts were made of clay mudbricks.











Between the buildings, the vertical and horizontal **roads** that were unearthed give an indicative image of the settlement's **urban planning** already since the Early Iron Age.













Excavation over the past years brought to light highly interesting archaeological **finds** (pottery, stone and metal tools, loom weights, bones and sea-shells).

The Project

The Sylloge Nummorum Graecorum is a British Academy. Research Project, the purpose of which is to publish illustrated catalogues of Greek coins in public and prive collections in the British Isles.

SNG has retained the traditional, very broad, definition of 'Greek' to include the coins produced by all ancient civilisations of the Mediterranean and neighbouring regic except Rome, though it does include the Roman Provincial series often known as 'Greek Imperials'.

The project was inaugurated in 1931 with the publication of the collection of Capt. E.G. Spencer-Churchill. A new and distinctive format was used, with text and illustrations on facing pages. This meant that only limited text was included, with the illustrations having greater prominence than in earlier types of catalogues, and to some extent replacing textual descriptions. This is because the primary purpose of *SNG* was to make much more material available for study. This format has been retained ever since and has been adopted, along with the title *Sylloge Nummorum Graecorum*, for similar projects in many other countries, including Denmark, France Germany, Greece, Israel, Sweden, Switzerland and the United States.

To date, the British *SNG* project has published over 30 fascicules from many different public and private collections, and the total world-wide exceeds 120 volumes. The project is supported by the Union Académique Internationale and information on *SNG* activities world-wide is now co-ordinated by the International Numismatic Commission. The *SNG* format has effectively become standard for the cataloguing of Greek coins for academic study, and it has also been adopted for other series, ethe *Sylloge of Coins of the British Isles (SCBI)*.
